

RULES FOR THE

DIETER BEHRENS MEDAL

(Founded and presented by the European Federation of Chemical Engineering)

AWARD

- 1. The purpose of the Dieter Behrens Medal is to recognise a significant contribution on behalf of the Federation in raising the profile of chemical engineering in Europe or in relation to the organisation, management or development of the EFCE's activity base.
- 2. The Dieter Behrens Medal is awarded in principle every four years and consists of a medal, a certificate, and an invitation to attend the European Congress of Chemical Engineering (ECCE), where the Medal is presented.
- 3. The award is sponsored by EFCE. The medal is donated by IChemE. The certificate is donated by DECHEMA. Travel expenses are borne by EFCE.
- 4. The medal, including certificate, is handed over by the President of the EFCE at the award ceremony.

DESIGNATION OF AWARD RECIPIENT

- 1. The recipient of the award is designated by the EFCE Executive Board.
- 2. The decision of the Executive Board is taken at its meeting 6 months prior to the ECCE where the Dieter Behrens Medal is presented. It is taken by the majority of votes of the members present. The decision is final.
- 3. Any Member Society of EFCE, Executive Board member or Chair of an EFCE Working Party or Section can nominate a candidate for the Dieter Behrens Medal to the Executive Board. The EFCE secretariat in charge of administrative affairs related to the Dieter Behrens Medal shall issue a call for nominations at least 4 months in advance of the Executive Board meeting where the decision shall be taken.
- 4. Nominations have to be in writing addressed to the EFCE secretariat responsible for all administrative affairs related to the Dieter Behrens Medal and should include a short CV of the nominee and reasons for his/her nomination. Written proposals must be received by the EFCE secretariat by a given deadline at least on month prior to the Executive Board meeting.
- 5. Serving members of the Executive Board are not eligible for nomination.
- 6. If no suitable proposals have been received, the Executive Board may decide not to award the Dieter Behrens Medal in a given year.

ADMINISTRATION

The Frankfurt Secretariat is in charge of all administrative affairs related to the Dieter Behrens Medal.
